In fact all the stoma care teams would prefer to know you have a problem so they can ensure it is sorted out to your satisfaction!! Appointments eem easier to get now and there is also an outreach clinic on one afternoon a week at South Bristol Community Hospital (ring the B.R.I. number to book).
