

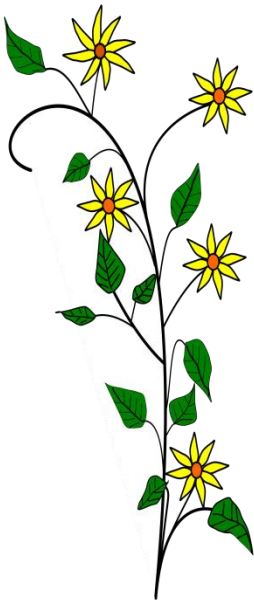

Showing how they are taken to Taunton for sorting then shipped out to refugee camps in various countries. They go directly to where they are needed and are dispensed by a fully qualified team! We will continue to collect what you no longer use at each meeting and will forward it all on to Wendy. You may remember Gill Down, the stoma care nurse from Southmead Hospital who was seconded to the CCG to sort out stoma care and prescribing in the region, came and gave us a talk on her work. There will be changes, some of the products will no longer be available on prescription, but if you NEED a product and the stoma nurses OK it you will be able to have it. You will, of course, be able to order products no longer prescribed direct from you supplier and pay for them if you so wish. There are likely to be changes in the whole stoma care operation in the region, hopefully with some more outreach clinics. Gill will be coming back to us to keep us up to date with what the final outcome is.

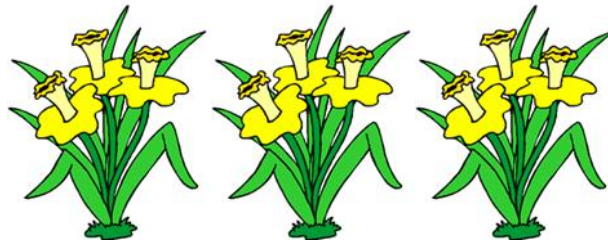
