Sore Skin and Leakage Good skin care is a crucial part of any stoma care routine because it will help maintain a healthy skin around your stoma and assist in successful stoma bag adhesion. Broken, red or sore skin may increase the risk of leakage and further skin damage. Left unattended, the skin condition may worsen, leading to discomfort for you and difficulty in getting your appliance to stick. Check out our tips on how to keep the skin around your stoma healthy.

Our **Stoma Aware Campaign** aims to tackle the stigma that still exists in some areas of society. The more society understands the easier it will become for people with stomas to lead fulfilling lives.

Toilets are a major focus for us as we know that for many ostomates, knowing that when they go out whether it's to the shops, for dinner, to a sports stadium or event venue, having confidence that there will be easily accessible and suitable toilets is almost like a comfort blanket, allowing people to go about their day and not have to worry.

That's why we want our campaign to be a catalyst for change, and we need your help. We've created a series of tools that you can use to present to business and organisations in your area to encourage them to make their facilities Stoma Friendly. Natasha explained the new procedure for ordering stoma supplies due to start in Spring 2023 (prescriptions to be authorised by the Stoma Nurse rather than the GP). She also spoke about hernias and how to manage them. Both topics proved to be very popular as she was inundated with members giving her feedback or asking their own personal questions. Our meeting venue – St James Priory



You may not be aware of the history of our venue, St James Priory. It was founded in 1129 by Robert, Earl of Gloucester, the illegitimate son of Henry I. It was a Benedictine monastic community until 1540 when Henry VIII suppressed the Monasteries and sold off their lands. The Nave of the Church was a Parish church until 1984 when it was declared redundant by the CofE. In 1993 the Little Brothers of Nazareth re-opened St James Priory. In 1996 they opened Walsingham House as an addiction rehab and in 1999 opened St James House as Supported Accommodation. In 2003 St

James Priory Project charity was established. Between 2007 and 2011 they applied for a £3.2m grant to the Heritage Lottery Fund and raised £1.2m as matched funding to conserve, renovate & develop St James & secure its heritage.

The Church is a Grade I listed building and in constant need of maintenance. They estimate that it costs £200 per day to keep the church open. Donations are welcomed by cheque or website www.stjamespriory.org.uk..


