
NEWSLETTER – Winter 2019

If anyone wonders where they all go the RAFT charity which takes them sends them out to third world countries and refugee camps to be distributed. So "thank you" in advance. It is a shame there is so much being donated – by that I mean it is a shame that the NHS is paying for so much surplus supplies. A box of bags costs about £100.00 p! If you are having problems and are trying out different bags you can get free samples from the supply companies or just order one box at a time and, if you can, cut them yourself until you are sure they are the right bag for you - it helps prevent waste.

Please bring your used stamps along to the next meeting – Christina has an outlet for these as well!
